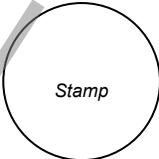

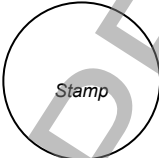

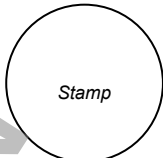

Section A (to be signed by the Accredited Veterinarian)		
I, the undersigned Accredited Veterinarian officially recognised by the Norwegian Food Safety Authority, hereby certify that the animals described above meet the following requirements: II.1 ☐ [Since birth]⁵⁾ or ☐ [within the 12 months prior to export]⁵⁾, there was no clinical or pathological evidence of tuberculosis, brucellosis or Aujeszky's disease found in the swine to be exported or any other animals in contact with them; II.2 During the 60 days prior to export, the swine were isolated from all other livestock in an embarkation quarantine facility approved by the Norwegian Food Safety Authority and placed under my supervision; II.3 During the 60 days prior to export, no swine erysipelas or swine plague (acute pasteurellosis) existed on the premises; II.4 During the 60 days prior to export, the swine were not held with other animals of lesser animal health status or with animals under any restrictions which would make them ineligible for export to the United States; II.5 I inspected the animals at the embarkation quarantine facility within 24 hours prior to export and found the swine to be free of clinical evidence of contagious or communicable disease, and as far as can be determined, any exposure to contagious or communicable disease, during the preceding 60 days in isolation; II.6 Within the 60 day period of quarantine prior to export, the swine were subjected to the following tests at least once with negative results: (a) Tuberculosis: an intradermal tuberculin test with animals injected with 0.1 mL of <i>Mycobacterium bovis</i> tuberculin. The injection site was visually observed and palpated 48 hours (plus or minus 6 hours) following injection. Date : (b) Brucellosis: ☐ [a buffered <i>Brucella</i> antigen test (card test, rose Bengal test or the buffered plate agglutination test)]⁵⁾ or ☐ [an ELISA (indirect or competitive) test]⁵⁾, conducted at a laboratory approved by Norwegian Accreditation¹⁾ Date : (c) Aujeszky's disease: ☐ [a serum neutralisation test at a dilution of 1:4]⁵⁾, or ☐ [an ELISA test using all the Aujeszky's disease viral antigens in the case of non-vaccinated-swine]⁵⁾, or ☐ [an ELISA test for the Aujeszky's disease g1 (gE) antigens in the case of swine vaccinated with a g1 (gE) deleted vaccine]⁵⁾, conducted at a laboratory approved by Norwegian Accreditation²⁾ Date : II.7 The swine will be transported from the embarkation quarantine facility to the port of embarkation in a conveyance which has been cleaned and disinfected before loading and will be sealed in my presence. Section B (to be signed by an Official Veterinarian of the Norwegian Food Safety Authority)		
I, the undersigned Official Veterinarian of the Norwegian Food Safety Authority, hereby certify that the animals described above meet the following requirements: II.11 They originate in Norway, designated by the USDA to be free of foot and mouth disease, classical swine fever (CSF), African swine fever (ASF) and swine vesicular disease; II.12 They have not been imported into Norway from countries/regions that are not recognized by the USDA in 9 CFR Part 94 and the APHIS Animal Health Status of Regions webpage³⁾ as free from foot and mouth disease and swine vesicular disease, or from zones established by the European Union (EU), any EU Member State, or Northern Ireland because of detection of ASF in domestic, wild, or feral swine; II.13 They have only been in countries/regions free from classical swine fever (except for the APHIS-defined European CSF region), as indicated in 9 CFR Part 93 and 94 and the APHIS Animal Health Status of Regions webpage³⁾; and they have not commingled with other swine that at any time were in a country/region or zone not recognized as free from classical swine fever as indicated on the APHIS Animal Health Status of Regions webpage³⁾; nor have they transited such countries/regions unless the swine were moved directly through the region or zone in a sealed means of conveyance with the seal determined to be intact upon arrival at the point of destination; II.14 They have not been in a restricted zone⁴⁾ in the APHIS-defined European CSF region established due to detection of CSF in domestic swine, from the time of detection until the designation of the zone as a restricted zone is removed by the competent veterinary authority of the EU Member State or country in the APHIS-defined European CSF region or until 6 months following depopulation of the swine on affected premises in the restricted zone and the cleaning and disinfection of the last affected premises in the zone, whichever period of time is later; II.15 They have not been in a restricted zone⁴⁾ in the APHIS-defined European CSF region established due to the detection of CSF in wild boar, from the time of detection until the designation of the zone as a restricted zone is removed by the competent authority of the EU Member State or country; II.16 They have not commingled with swine that have at any time been in any of the countries/regions or zones described in points II.14 and II.15 unless the swine are exported after the periods described in these sections; II.17 According to the planned itinerary, the transport will not pass through any region or zone described in II.14 and II.15, unless the swine are moved directly through the region or zone in a sealed means of conveyance with the seal determined to be intact by the Official Veterinarian or Accredited Veterinarian in Section C of this certificate on arrival at the place of loading, or unless the swine are exported after the periods described in II.14 and II.15; II.18 The swine for export have not at any time transited through, and as far as can be determined according to planned itinerary for export, the swine will not transit any countries/regions where ASF is known to exist, or through zones established by the EU, any EU Member State, or Northern Ireland because of detection of ASF in domestic, wild or feral swine; II.19 The swine were not vaccinated with any live or attenuated or inactivated vaccine during the 14 days preceding export to the United States. NOTE: If the swine were vaccinated for Aujeszky's disease, a complete vaccination record must be provided, in English or with an English translation. II.20 They have been treated before and at the time of loading at the embarkation quarantine facility in accordance with the relevant provisions of Regulation (EC) No 1/2005, in particular as regards watering and feeding and they are fit for the intended transport;

Section C (to be signed at the place of loading by the local Official Veterinarian or Accredited Veterinarian)		
I, the undersigned Official Veterinarian or Accredited Veterinarian, hereby certify that: II.25 The swine described above have arrived at the place of loading in a sealed means of conveyance. The seal was intact when I broke it; II.26 No livestock, other than those intended for export to the United States, were aboard the means of conveyance that transported the swine to the place of loading; II.27 The transporting aircraft or vessel has been cleaned and disinfected prior to loading; II.28 All hay, straw, forage, feed and bedding aboard the transporting aircraft or vessel originated in Norway or an EU Member State designated by the USDA to be free of foot and mouth disease and swine vesicular disease, and not affected with African swine fever as indicated in 9 CFR Part 94 and the APHIS Animal Health Status of Regions webpage³⁾; II.29 No equipment or materials used in transporting the swine to the United States may have previously been used for transporting swine that do not meet the above requirements, unless the equipment or materials have first been cleaned and disinfected; II.30 No livestock, other than those intended for export to the United States are aboard the transporting aircraft or vessel; II.31 The captain or transport carrier has been informed of the transportation requirements described in this Section.

- 1) Test records must accompany the shipment. Samples that react positively must be retested with negative results using a suitable confirmatory test such as the complement fixation test.
- 2) Test records must accompany the shipment.

- 4) A restricted zone for classical swine fever is defined as an area, delineated by the relevant competent veterinary authorities of the region in which the area is located, that surrounds and includes the location of an outbreak of classical swine fever in domestic swine or detection of the disease in wild boar, and from which the movement of domestic swine is prohibited.
- 5) Delete as appropriate.
